## Your Priorities - What we did

### Bowness North:

Anti-Social Behaviour and Underage drinking continue to be confronted whenever it is reported, of particular concern for this area has been regards to the grounds of Windermere Rugby Club. All officers in the Lakes NPT have been made aware of the concerns of residents and are to monitor the area especially in the evenings.

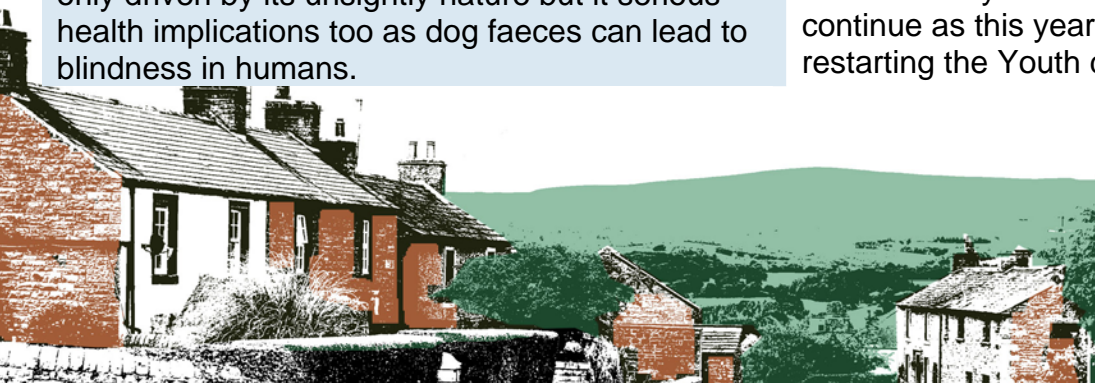
As to dog-fouling, special early morning patrols are arranged in an ad hoc basis with the SLDC to keep an eye out for early-day offenders, and Community Officers will challenge anyone else guilty of this offence as well during their normal course of duty. The fine for the offence of failing to clear up behind your dog is £75. This is not only driven by its unsightly nature but it serious health implications too as dog faeces can lead to blindness in humans.

## Crime In Your Area - Follow Up

### CRIMEMAPPING:

Crimemapping is a system of looking at the previous 3 months level of various crimes in comparison to the same period the year before:

The crime figures for this area are improving, with the level of Burglaries and Robberies in the previous 3 months being thankfully non-existent. Vehicle crime has fallen from 2 within the last 3 months from 3 for the same period last year and Violent crime has fallen further, from 7 instances to only just 2 now. Anti-Social Behaviour calls, which tend to attract wider attention, has also seen a decrease, from an average of 14 incidents a month last year, for this period, to now just over 9. This has largely been to the efforts of the Community team and its partner agencies to engage youths in a wide variety of diversionary activities which will continue as this year progresses: including restarting the Youth discos on the 30<sup>th</sup> October.

### Bowness South:

Anti-Social Behaviour and Underage drinking continues to be confronted, with drink having been recently removed from some youths who had been drinking in the area of the Glebe. Youth drinking is an ongoing concern not only due to the general disorder that can ensue from it, but also because of the health repercussions on the younger members of our society.

As to dog-fouling, special early morning patrols are arranged in an ad hoc basis with the SLDC to keep an eye out for early-day offenders, and Community Officers will challenge anyone else guilty of this offence as well during their normal course of duty. The fine for the offence of failing to clear up behind your dog is £75. This is not only driven by its unsightly nature but it serious health implications too as dog faeces can lead to blindness in humans.

### CRIMEMAPPING:

Crimemapping is a system of looking at the previous 3 months level of various crimes in comparison to the same period the year before:

For Bowness South the news is not as good. Burglaries have seen a slight increase to an average now of 2 a month. We would recommend that people please ensure that their property is secure before they leave it. We are currently undertaking Operation **Sedbury** to target this type of criminal. Also, should anyone see anything suspicious we would ask them to ring the CrimeStoppers number above.

Vehicle crime figures have fallen, but violent crime has shown a small increase, from 4 incidences over the last year's 3 month period to 6 for this year. Lastly, Anti-Social Behaviour reports have shown a dramatic decline, falling from an average of 39 reports a month to 27 now. For Bowness South this is not always youth related, as there is a large licensing district in the area, but for the youths especially we engage them in many diversionary activities in an aim to keep them out of trouble.
